As readers, we will read a variety of books based on fairy stories. Children will develop in their comprehension, inference and prediction skills.



As learners of religion, our themes for study are:

- Sikhism
- waiting

We will reflect on the following big question:

Is waiting always difficult?

As writers, we will write to narrate and to instruct. We will use 'Rapunzel' as our vehicle text.



As athletes, we will develop our net and wall game skills including:

Striking a ball

weather patterns:

- Throwing for accuracy and power
- Communicating well with others

We also cover **gymnastics** this term with a focus on **balancing and spinning on points and patches.**

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As computer scientists, we will be using modern tales to learn about online safety:

- Children will record the weather to identify weather patterns.
